The **SVP Christmas Church Gate collection** takes place at all Masses 8/9 December. Your contribution would be greatly appreciated.

Despite improving employment situations, SVP Athboy have continued to find a slight increase in requests for help from year to year.

73 individuals were helped this year – some on a once off basis, others for a period of time. The main triggers for seeking help are low income with unreliable weekly hours and high housing costs.

Help is mainly given towards food, fuel or education/training. Some of those previously supported in education/training have qualified and are now self-supporting. It cost €31,500 last year to provide this support to families in need locally.

This money was all raised locally – no state aid is available.
